



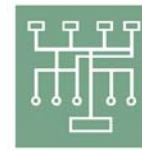

SOS Children's Village is a non-profit organization that builds permanent homes serving foster children and sibling groups who are unlikely to be reunited with their biological parents and unlikely to be adopted.

This project is the first urban SOS Village in America, providing 16 new family focused homes, and was constructed in Chicago at 76th Street and Parnell.

HOH was proud to be a part of this worthwhile and gratifying project.

Engineering services provided the design of new streets, alleys, sidewalks, curb and gutter, watermain, sanitary sewer, retaining walls, lighting, complete field surveys including detailed topographic surveys with base line and bench mark establishment, data collection, utility plans, cross sections and earthwork details; quantities, cost estimates and specifications. Drainage and new sewer construction included: an in-line detention basin using pre-cast concrete sections. Many of the sewers in the project were replaced with new upgraded sewer systems. The project required coordination with all the city utility departments. The previous use of the site was a manufacturing plant, creating areas of hazardous waste. The site grading and underground utility locations were established to minimize the amount of hazardous material removal. Generally, three feet of clean fill was placed over the existing grade.
